SHOOTING PARA SPORT COMPETITION

The Paris 2024 Paralympic Games shooting Para sport competition will be held from Friday 30 August to Thursday 5 September at the Châteauroux Shooting Centre.

A total of 160 athletes, 45 men, 60 women and 55 gender free, may take part in the shooting Para sport competition. For details of the qualification system, see IPC website.

This competition will consist of the following 13 events:

→ Medal Events

- R8 – Women's 50m Rifle 3 Positions SH1

MIXED (7)

COMPETITION FORMAT

The shooting finals have a maximum of between 24 and 60 shots, with athletes who are ranked up to third place being eliminated at progressive stages during each final. The table below summarises the format of each Paralympic shooting event:

R4 – Mixed 10m Air Rifle Standing SH2	60 shots, 60 min	- 14 single shots, each fired in 50 sec (30 sec for 10m and 50m Rifle Prone events)
R5 – Mixed 10m Air Rifle Prone SH2	60 shots, 60 min	- Total of 24 shots
R6 – Mixed 50m Air Rifle Prone SH1	60 shots, 50 min	- Scoring in finals is done with the tenth-ring (decimal) scoring.
P1 – Men’s 10m Air Pistol SH1	60 shots, 75 min	- The lowest ranking finalist is eliminated after twelve (12) shots and so on after every two (2) shots until gold and silver medals are decided on shot 24.
P2 – Women’s 10m Air Pistol SH1	60 shots, 75 min	- The lowest ranking finalist is eliminated after twelve (12) shots and so on after every two (2) shots until gold and silver medals are decided on shot 24.
P3 – Mixed 25m Pistol SH1	30 + 30 shots, 5 min/5-shot series (precision stage) 3 x 7 sec/5-shot series (rapid stage)	- The top eight (8) athletes from the qualification advance to the final. - The final consists of ten (10) rapid-fire series - Elimination of the lowest-scoring finalists begins after the fourth series and continues until the tenth series when the gold and silver medallists are decided. - Scoring is hit or miss - The hit zone is the zone with a value of 10.2 points or above.

→ Rifle and pistol tiebreaking (to advance to finals from qualification)

All ties in the 50m, 25m and 10m pistol events will be broken by applying the following rules:

- The highest number of inner tens.
- The highest score in the last 10-shot series (not bullseyes or decimals), working backward by 10-shot series to the tie. If any ties remain, scores will be compared on a shot-by-shot basis using bullseyes: a bullseye outranks a ten that is not a bullseye, beginning with the last shot, then the next-to-last shot and so on.
- If any ties remain, scores will be compared on a shot-by-shot basis using decimal ring scores beginning with the last shot, then the next-to-last shot and so on.
- When decimal scoring is used for 10m air rifle qualification events, ties will be broken by the highest score of the last 10-shot series, and then by comparing decimal scores on a shot-by-shot basis beginning with the last shot, then the next-to-last shot and so on.

→ Draws

The draws for the qualification rounds will be conducted before the Technical Meeting. The draws for firing order in finals will be determined by computer draws immediately after preliminary qualification results are official.



RULES

The Paris 2024 shooting Para sport competition will take place in accordance with the editions of the following documents that are in force at the time of the Games:

In accordance with the “Paralympic Games” chapter of the IPC Handbook, WSPS will be responsible for the control and direction of the shooting Para sport competition at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.

→ Scoring

In all events, shots are fired at 10-ring targets; scoring is done electronically by measuring the distance between the centre of the shot hole and the centre of the target. Qualification scores entitle a place in the final but do not carry forward. Finals scoring starts from zero (0). For finals, the 10 decimal score zones are from 10.0 to a maximum 10.9.

In men’s, women’s and mixed 10m rifle events, decimal scoring is used for the qualification and finals events.

In the men’s and women’s 10m air pistol events, decimal scoring is only used for the finals events.

In the 50m rifle and pistol events, full ring scoring will be used for qualification and decimal scoring for the finals.

In 25m pistol events, the centre of the target is worth a maximum 10 points. In precision events/stages, competitors aim at the standard 10-ring target; with full ring scoring used in qualification events and decimal scoring used in finals.

A “hit-or-miss” scoring system will be used in finals. In finals, 10.2 and over is scored as a “hit” (one point).

COMPETITION VENUE

→ Châteauroux (CTX)

Châteauroux Shooting Centre - 36130 Déols - France

The shooting Para sport competition will be held at the Châteauroux Shooting Centre, located 290 kilometres to the south of Paris and 6 kilometres to the east of Châteauroux. The shooting ranges are permanent and already constitute a world class shooting venue for the Olympic disciplines. The gross capacity of the venue for the shooting competitions at Paris 2024 will be 2,500, made up of 2,400 for rifle and pistol, according to the session (600 for the rifle and pistol finals range, 800 for the 25m qualification range and 500 for the 10m/50m qualification ranges).

→ Field of play

The venue will contain the following competition areas:

- One (1) 10m Air Rifle and Air Pistol qualification range. There will be 60 targets available.
- One (1) 50m Rifle and Pistol qualification range. There will be 60 targets available.
- One (1) 25m Pistol qualification range. There will be 40 targets available.
- One (1) Rifle and Pistol finals range. There will be 10 targets available for the 10m/50m finals and 15 targets available for the 25m finals.

All competition areas and all equipment will comply with the ISSF technical Rules and Regulations. The Rifle and Pistol shooting ranges are equipped with the latest Suis AG electronic targets.

→ Facilities

The Châteauroux shooting ranges will have the following facilities:

- changing rooms (separate men's and women's)
- break room for athletes
- lounge for officials
- catering services
- Internet access
- armoury for rifles and pistols
- equipment storage for athletes
- dry fire area
- service industry work area
- mixed zones for accredited media to interview athletes after their competition
- medical services
- area for team physiotherapists
- doping control station
- sport information desk

SHOOTING PARA SPORT TRAINING

Training for the shooting Para sport competition will also take place at the Châteauroux Shooting Centre. The venue will be open for training from 21 August to 4 September 2024, during the periods indicated below in the training schedule.

Note that times may change according to training days.

There will be no training on the afternoon of the Opening Ceremony.

The Châteauroux shooting range facilities for training will include:

- changing rooms
- armoury
- athletes' lounge
- area for teams' physiotherapists
- equipment storage for athletes
- catering services
- medical facilities

All equipment will be approved by WSPS and will comply with the IPC Practical Guidelines.

FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION TRANSPORTATION AND SECURITY

The Paris 2024 Games will be held in a secure environment in France, supported by the application of the necessary rules and regulations concerning firearms and ammunition. Athletes who participate in the shooting competitions must comply with French law and adhere to the procedures aiming to guarantee respect for the law. Paris 2024 will provide services and logistics support to athletes and teams to ensure that these rules are observed. Teams and athletes are strongly advised to refer to the Firearms and Ammunition Guides published in the Paris 2024 *Customs and Freight Guide and the Chef de Mission Guide*, published on IPC Exchange.

Below is a non-exhaustive list of the legal regulations on firearms and ammunition:

- Only athletes who have received permission can possess, store, carry or transport their firearms and ammunition;
- Permitted firearms and ammunition cannot be shared with another individual.
- Permission is required to:
 1. import or export firearms and ammunition,
 2. acquire, transfer or dispose of ammunition.
- Firearms and ammunition must be within the reach of the athlete who has received permission, unless they are stored in the armoury.
- The athlete must always be in possession of this permit:
 - if they use the Paris 2024 official firearms and ammunition transport to the Châteauroux Shooting Centre
 - or if they transport the firearms and ammunition to the Châteauroux Shooting Centre themselves.

- To receive Paris 2024 logistics support for the import, export and transport of firearms and ammunition, NPCs must submit the required information regarding arrivals and departures, firearms and ammunition of their athletes to Paris 2024 by a date that will be confirmed by Paris 2024 in the *Firearms and Ammunition Guide*. Paris 2024 will then ask the respective government authorities for the import/export and transport permits on behalf of the athletes.

For athletes to qualify for Paris 2024 support, they must meet the following conditions:

- Firearm ammunition must be used for the Games and transported by the athletes themselves.
- If an athlete does not meet the above criteria, they must import, export, transport and store firearms and ammunition on their own according to French legislation. In this case, the teams and athletes are responsible for obtaining all required permits from the relevant government authorities, and for transporting the firearms and ammunition to the armoury at the Châteauroux Shooting Centre at an agreed time and date.

Taking firearms or ammunition to the Paralympic Village is strictly prohibited.

The Fédération Française de Tir (FFTir – French Shooting Federation) will act as an agent appointed on behalf of Paris 2024 to provide the ammunition sales service at the Châteauroux shooting ranges, for the competition and training, to athletes in need. The details on the nature of the ammunition and the sales prices will be distributed to the teams at the beginning of 2024.
